**Just wondering?** What is "**Maundy Thursday?**" This is in memory of Jesus' last supper with his disciples when he gave them his last commandment. The word 'maundy' is a shortened form of the Latin, *mandatum*, the word for command. And this is the beautiful commandment. "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another" (John 13:34). He washed their feet in a show of humility and love, and asked them to wash each other's feet, before they shared their last meal together.
